

Important Information

BLESSING: Religious articles are blessed at the altar on the First Sunday of every month after Mass. The Blessing of Expectant Mothers will take place on the Second Sunday of every month after Mass.

BAPTISM: Baptisms are by appointment. At least one parent as well as the sponsor (only one sponsor is required) must be practicing Roman Catholics who attend the Traditional Latin Mass exclusively. For further information please phone Father for arrangements.

CONFIRMATIONS: The Sacrament of Confirmation will be administered every year around Pentecost.

CATECHISM: Catechism classes take place every Wednesday at West Chester Library, 9363 Centre Pointe Drive, West Chester, OH 45069 at 10:30 AM.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION: First Holy Communions will be made on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. First Communion Catechism classes every Sunday at 11:10 AM.

CONFESSIONS: Confessions are heard before Masses on Sunday, and whenever a second priest is available, during Mass also. Appointments for confession may be made during the week with Father.

MATRIMONY: If you are contemplating marriage, please make an appointment to speak with Father before setting a date.

FUNERALS: Simply call Father before calling the funeral director. Father will help you to make all the necessary arrangements.

LAST RITES & SICK CALLS: Father serves a wide area and must often travel far to administer these sacraments. Please do not put off making arrangements until the last moment. Let us know if a church member is sick, hospitalized or in danger of death.

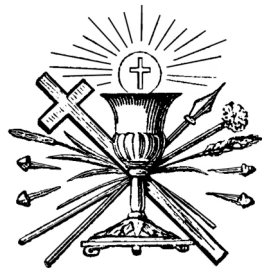
Open House

Note from Father

The month of March is particularly dedicated to Saint Joseph. When we think of Saint Joseph we have really to say that he was subject to the will of God in all things. He was subject to the will of God in the various tribulations and difficulties of life. We may rightly think that if anyone should have been preserved from life's problems it would have been St. Joseph and our blessed Lady. But it is not so. Just take a look at one event in the life of Saint Joseph. Joseph travels with Mary from Nazareth to Bethlehem to be enrolled there according to an edict of Augustus Caesar. Fatigued by the long and laborious journey, and solicitous for Mary, he seeks a night's lodging, but finds none. Wherever he knocks he meets with a cold reception; they are everywhere refused with the words, "we have no room". Night advances, but Joseph and Mary have not yet found a lodging. He sees himself compelled to leave Bethlehem and to seek shelter in a miserable stable. How much must he have felt this abandonment and his inability to assist Mary, whose delicate condition required affectionate care. But he preserves the most perfect patience and subjects himself silently and with confidence to the will of God, according to whose inscrutable wisdom this severe trial had come upon him.

We should learn from Saint Joseph to have great and unshakeable confidence in the decrees of Divine Providence. Be it in times of peace in our lives, or in unbelievable troubles and trials, which we sometimes have to undergo like St. Joseph. Be it interior doubts, be it problems in your workplace, or be it problems within your own family, always trust in God like Saint Joseph. Let us have a special devotion to Saint Joseph. Remember that he is not the patron for this problem or that problem; in other words, he isn't in charge of any particular need, but rather he is the patron saint for *all* our needs.

St. Thomas Aquinas says: "*Some saints are privileged to extend to us their patronage in certain cases, but not in others; but to our holy patron St. Joseph it is given to assist us in all cases, in every necessity, in every undertaking.*"

43. When thou hearest Mass aright, thou dost perform an act of highest worship.
44. By hearing Mass thou dost pay the most profound reverence, the most loyal homage, to the sacred humanity of Our Lord.
45. It is the best means whereby to venerate the passion of Christ, and obtain a share in its fruits.
46. It is also the best means of venerating the Blessed Mother of God, and increasing her joy.
47. By hearing Mass thou canst give greater honor to the angels and saints than by reciting many prayers.
48. By hearing Mass devoutly thou canst also enrich thy soul more than by aught else in the world.
49. For in this act thou dost perform a good work of the highest value.
50. It is a signal exercise of pure faith, which will receive a great reward.
51. When thou dost bow down before the sacred host and the sacred chalice, thou dost perform a supreme act of adoration.
52. For each time thou dost gaze reverently upon the sacred host thou wilt receive a recompense from heaven.
53. Each time thou dost smite thy breast with compunction some of thy sins are remitted to thee.
54. If thou hearest Mass in a state of mortal sin, God offers thee the grace of conversion.
55. If thou hearest Mass in a state of grace, God gives thee an augmentation of grace.
56. In holy Mass thou dost spiritually eat the flesh of Christ, and drink His blood.
57. Thou art privileged to behold with thine eyes Christ hidden under the sacramental veil, and to be beheld by Him.
58. Thou dost receive the priest's benediction, which is confirmed by Christ in heaven.
59. Through thy diligence in hearing Mass thou wilt also obtain corporal and temporal blessings.
60. Furthermore, thou wilt be preserved from many misfortunes that would otherwise befall thee.
