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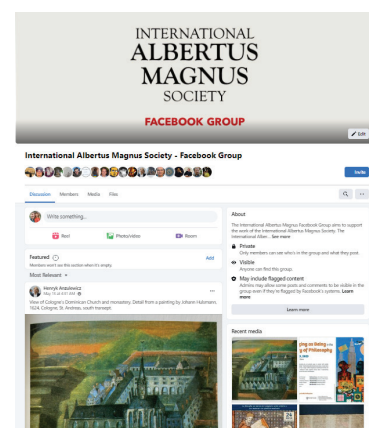

ACADEMIC EVENTS



JUNE 2023: On June 14, **Valerio Bonanno** is scheduled to defend his doctoral dissertation, *Das Theologieverständnis Alberts des Großen. Eine neue Lektüre*. He is seeking a doctoral degree jointly from the University of Cologne and the École Pratique des Hautes Études (Paris) under the direction of **Andreas Speer** (Cologne) and **Dominique Poirel** (Paris).

MAY 2023 – The Division of the Humanities and Social Sciences at Caltech is devoting its annual Bacon Conference, scheduled this year for May 18-20, to a memorial Conference in Memory of Noel M. Swerdlow, renown historian of astronomy, entitled “Thematic Continuities in Astronomy and Astrology from Antiquity to the Renaissance.” Included in the conference, the only paper highlighting medieval Latin history of astronomy, will be a presentation by **Betsey Price** (York University), “Eeny, meeny, miny, moe: Albertus Magnus’ Choice of a Lunar Model.” A proceedings volume will follow in due course, offering the opportunity for expansion on the conference presentations. MAY 2023 – The Franciscan Institute at Saint Bonaventure University has helped launch a new research initiative, “St. Bonaventure as a Reader of St. Albert the Great,” that brings together Franciscanists and Dominicanists to study both how St. Bonaventure relied on the writings of St. Albert and the shared intellectual culture of the Franciscans and Dominicans at the University of Paris in the mid-13th century. It sponsored its inaugural session at the 47th Patristics, Medieval, and Renaissance (PMR) Conference held at Villanova University October 21-23, 2022. The next session of the “St. Bonaventure as a Reader of St. Albert the Great”-initiative will take place at a Franciscan Institute-sponsored virtual session during the May 2023 International Congress on Medieval Studies hosted by Western Michigan University at Kalamazoo, Michigan. Three papers will contribute to the ongoing discussion. **Jonathan Gaworski** (Catholic University of America) will examine Bonaventure and Albert’s application of Dionysius’ concept of hierarchy to the Trinity. **Gregory LaNave** (Dominican House of Studies) will compare the theological methods of Bonaventure and Albert. **David Twetten** (Marquette University) will consider the Averroist cosmological language not found in Latin translations of Averroes yet found in a tradition of Franciscan and Dominican writings at Paris and Oxford in Albert, Roger Bacon, and Grosseteste. APRIL 2023: On April 13, **Julie Casteigt**, PhD (HDR), defended her doctoral dissertation in Theology at the Centre Sèvres of the Facultés jésuites de Paris. CURRENT RESEARCH PROJECTS

Therese Cory is working on mental being in Albert for a paper on mental being in the 13th century.

Irven M. Resnick and **Kenneth F. Kitchell, Jr.**, are preparing a complete, annotated translation of Thomas of Cantimpré's *De natura rerum* for the Catholic University of America Press, Fathers of the Church Medieval Continuations Series, to appear in two volumes in late 2025.

Sr. Albert Marie Surmanski, OP, is working on an English translation of Albert's *De Sacramentis* for the Catholic University of America Press, Fathers of the Church Medieval Continuations Series.

David Torrijos-Castrillejo is working on a Spanish translation of the chapter on beauty from Albert's *Commentary on the Divine Names*. His work is part of a research project entitled “Traducción de textos medievales sobre estética” that has been underway in the Faculty of Philosophy of the Universidad Eclesiástica San Dámaso (Madrid) since 2020.

Marcin Trepczyński (with collaborators **Andrea Nannini** and **Marcin Będkowski**) is carrying out a project from 2021-2023 entitled “Reasoning in Biblical Exegesis: From Stephen Langton to Thomas Aquinas.” The project focuses on the Biblical commentaries written by Stephen Langton, Robert Grosseteste, Albert the Great, Bonaventure, and Thomas Aquinas.

Paul M.J.E. Tummers is working on an English translation and analysis of Albertus Magnus' *Super Euclidem*, including a comparison with other Euclid-versions of the 13th-century. A first draft has been finished and the final draft may be ready in the near future.

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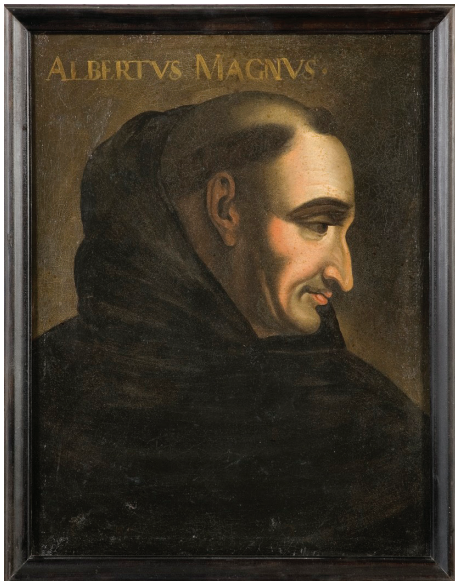
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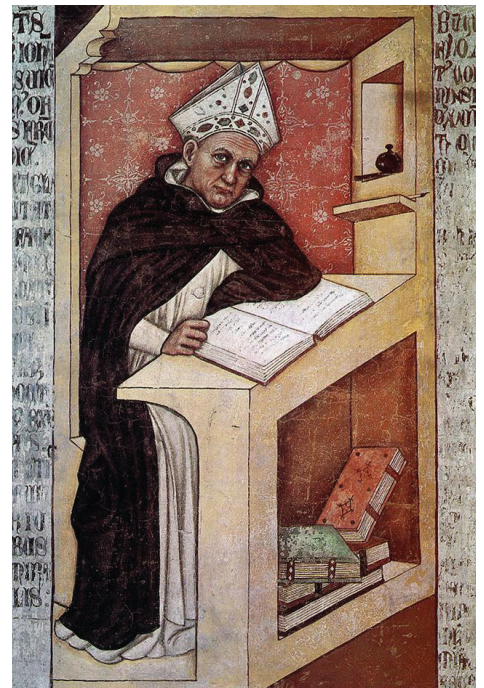
Upcoming Annual Meeting of Members
